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Topic 1. Sin

1. Sin

INTRODUCTION

Sin is such a strong offense that it can only be cleaned through death. As sinners, we deserved eternal death, but Jesus, in his unfailing love, gave his life to die in our place. During his moment of death, Jesus was burdened with all the sins of humanity. When he died he paid for our sins and freed us from that curse.

Isaiah 53:6 All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, everyone, to his own way; And the LORD has laid on HIM the iniquity of us all.

1. What is sin?

A= Whatever a person does that is against God's will.

2. What has provoked sin?

A= A barrier between God and man that only Jesus Christ could remove.

• **Note:** We can see that sin is doing the contrary to God's plan and a consequence to this is the division between man and his creator.

3. Where did sin originate from?

A= Heaven

Isaiah 14:12-14 "How you are fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! How you are cut down to the ground, You who weakened the nations! For you have said in your heart: 'I will ascend into heaven, I will exalt my throne above the stars of God; I will also sit on the mount of the congregation on the farthest sides of the north; I will ascend above the heights of the clouds, **I will be like the Most High.**'(Instructor, please read until verse 21).

- Note: The devil tried to be like God, so he was cast from the kingdom of God.
- 4. To whom do the practices of sin belong to?

A= The devil.

1 John 3:8 He who sins is of the devil, for the devil has sinned from the beginning. For this purpose, the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil.

5. Who did sin begin with in humanity?

A=Adam and Eve.

Genesis 3:17, 23-24 Then to Adam said, "Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat of it': "Cursed is the ground for your sake; in toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life. (23) Therefore, the Lord God sent him out of the Garden of Eden to till the ground from which he was taken. **24** So He drove out the man; and He placed cherubim at the east of the Garden of Eden, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way to the tree of life.

- Note: Adam and Eve disobeyed God when they ate of the said tree. This is how sin began in the world; with the human race.
- 6. What should our attitude be towards sin?

A= Reject and flee from it.

1 John 1:8-10 If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. **9** If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. **10** If we say that we have not sinned, we make Him a liar, and His word is not in us.

7. What do we have to do to receive forgiveness from our sins?

A= Wholeheartedly repent and ask God for forgiveness.

1 John 2:1 *My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate (Intercessor) with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous.*

8. Who did king David sin against?

A= Against God.

2 Samuel 12:12-13 12 For you did it secretly, but I will do this thing before all Israel, before the sun. **13** So David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the Lord." And Nathan said to David, "The Lord also has put away your sin; you shall not die."

- 9. What did king David have to do so that God would forgive him?A=Repent and plead for forgiveness.
 - Note: The king repented and received forgiveness. Man tries to hide sin, however, God cannot be fooled. God knows it and he knows everything. If a seed of sin is planted, then that is the harvest we will receive. However, repentance means a change in attitude.

10. What does the Word of God say about forgiveness of sins?

A= Micah 7:19 *He will again have compassion on us, and will subdue our iniquities.* You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea.

• Note: No one has ever gone to the depths of the sea, and no one will ever go there because that is how God has established it. It is the place where God places our sins and he will never think of them again. Never forget that God's mercy is big.

11. What is the wage of sin?

A= Death.

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

• Note: The word death means separation and when we mention spiritual death, it means a separation from God. God wants us to reach forgiveness through the sacrifice Jesus Christ made and through eternal life.

12. What is the solution to not having spiritual death?

A= Accept Jesus Christ and confess that we want him to live within us.

John 3:16 For God so loved the World that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

Romans 10:9-10 That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. **10** For with the

heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Note: As sinners we deserved eternal death, but in his everlasting love, Jesus offered his life so that he could die in our place. During his moment of death, Jesus was burdened with all the sins of humanity, and when he died, he paid for our sins and freed us from that curse. Now, it is our job to respond with love and faithfulness to the beautiful sacrifice Jesus Christ did. There is no other way but giving our lives and hearts to Christ and acknowledging him at every moment.

Isaiah 53:6 All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way; And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

Topic 2. Repentance

2. Repentance

INTRODUCTION

Repentance means to return or come back from. It is a voluntary change in the life and mind of a person; it is to change direction.

1. What is repentance?

A= To recognize that we are sinners, and accept that without God we behave incorrectly.

Luke 15:7 *I* say to you that likewise there will be more joy in Heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine just persons who need no repentance.

• **Note:** When there is genuine repentance, there is joy in the heavens and God begins to act immediately.

2. Does God give an opportunity to everyone?

A= Yes. God wants us all to achieve repentance and for no one to get lost.

2 Peter 3:9 The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, **not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance**.

• Note: God has not come to make judgement, thanks to His great love. He (patiently) wants us all to proceed towards repentance. Let us not put an end to God's patience. Instead let us reflect on the fact that He is coming soon and we need to repent from our way of life.

3. What can we repent from?

A= By nature we are sinners who need to repent.

Galatians 5:19-21 Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

- **Note:** Every human being is found on the list of those who will not inherit the kingdom of God, which is why we need to wholeheartedly repent.
- 4. If people who are worse sinners than us exist, then why don't they repent?A= We all sin and we all have to repent; regardless of how big or small the sin may be; sin is sin.

Luke 13:2-3 And Jesus answered and said to them, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans, because they suffered such things? **3** I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish.

- Note: It is not valid to think that others are the ones that need to repent and not you. We are all sinners in the big and in the small. We need to repent!
- 5. How do we need to repent?
 - **A=** Opening our hearts to God, being honest and sincere with ourselves and with our creator.

2 Chronicles 7:14 If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from Heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land.

• Note: There are three conditions in order to be heard by God: be humble, pray and change; it is then when God will listen to you, forgive your sins and heal your heart.

6. Is there crying during repentance?

A= In genuine repentance, there is crying.

Luke 22:61-62 And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had said to him, "Before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." 62 So Peter went out and wept bitterly.

 Note: Peter kept saying that he would never fail the Lord, however we can see that in one night he denied Him three times. The same way, we need to recognize that we too fail the Lord and that we need to repent. When Peter cried bitterly, genuine repentance led to change.

7. Does God see the repentance of the heart?

A= Yes, those with broken and humble hearts

Joel 2:13 So tear your hearts, and not your garments; Return to the Lord your God, For He is gracious and merciful, Slow to anger, and of great kindness; And He relents from doing harm.

 Note: God motivates us to achieve repentance of the heart. He does not care for the sacrifices Man could offer because Man always goes back to the sin they had (supposedly) repented from. God knows your heart and He cannot be fooled. He is happy with the simple and humble hearted.

8. What is the difference between genuine and false repentance?

A= Genuine repentance brings salvation, but false repentance brings death.

2 Corinthians 7:10 For godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation, not to be regretted; but the sorrow of the world produces death.

• Note: If you feel the sadness that God feels because you've done something wrong, repent; He will forgive and save. And if you feel remorse from the world or false sadness, then prepare yourself to receive death.

9. What fruits must we have with repentance?

A= Fruits worthy of repentance.

Matthew 3:8 Therefore bear fruits worthy of repentance.

Acts 26:20 But declared first to those in Damascus and in Jerusalem, and throughout all the region of Judea, and then to the Gentiles, that they should repent, turn to God, and do works befitting repentance.

• Note: When there is genuine repentance, our heart will be clean and we will seek to do things worthy of repentance.

10. What characteristics must we have with repentance?

A= Completely change our attitude.

Ephesians 4:25-32 Therefore, putting away lying, "Let each one of you speak truth with his neighbor," for we are members of one another. **26** "Be angry, and do not sin": do not let the sun go down on your wrath, **27** nor give place to the devil. **28** Let him

who stole steal no longer, but rather let him labor, working with his hands what is good, that he may have something to give him who has need. **29** Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers. **30** And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. **31** Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. **32** And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you.

 Note: The Lord motivates us to show such characteristics when there is genuine repentance. Christ is in our hearts, so we should give him the opportunity to work in our lives, which will lead to an easier path to fulfilling His purpose. With false repentance, it will always be impossible to continue the walk of Christ.

11. If someone did something wrong to us and repents, should we forgive them?A= Yes, the same way that God forgives us, he desires for us to do the same with others.

Luke 17:3-4 Take heed to yourselves. If your brother sins against you, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him. **4** And if he sins against you seven times in a day, and seven times in a day returns to you, saying, 'I repent,' you shall forgive him."

• Note: The Lord Jesus Christ notices the repentance man has with Him, but He also motivates us to forgive all of those who have offended or hurt us.

12. Does God rejoice in repentance?

A= Yes, he rejoiced with all those who repent.

Jonah 3:9-10 Who can tell if God will turn and relent, and turn away from His fierce anger, so that we may not perish? **10** Then God saw their works that they turned from their evil way; and God relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it.

 Note: When God sees the heart of a person, of an entire people group, city, or nation, he rejoices and extends his forgiveness and mercy. I motivate you all to pray for repentance of our families, colonies, town, city and countries so that God can change everyone.

13. Are there people who know of God's forgiveness and make themselves insensitive?

A= Yes, and they listen more to their friends and the devil.

Proverbs 23:35 Let your father and your mother be glad and let her who bore you rejoice.

Ephesians 4:18-20 Having their understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God, because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart; **19** who, being past feeling, have given themselves over to lewdness, to work all uncleanness with greediness. **20** But you have not so learned Christ (the Messiah).

 Note: People suffer and need repentance, but sometimes our pride is bigger and we begin to think about what our friends will say. These people pay more attention to what the devil says, and what sin and vengeance says, that it leads them to be insensitive towards the forgiveness they can receive from God.

14. Who are the ones that don't repent?

A= The ones with hardened hearts.

Revelations 9:20-21 But the rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, did not repent of the works of their hands, that they should not worship demons, and idols of gold, silver, brass, stone, and wood, which can neither see nor hear nor walk.
21 And they did not repent of their murders or their sorceries or their sexual immorality or their thefts.

Revelations 16:9 And men were scorched with great heat, and they blasphemed the name of God who has power over these plagues; and they did not repent and give Him glory.

• Note: As you can see, there are people that don't repent even though they know that there is a God and there is judgement, which for this reason they will not reach salvation.

• God bless you and remember:

Topic 3. Forgiveness

3.Forgiveness

INTRODUCTION

God desires that every believer lives a Christ like, victorious, life. However, God knows that there will be moments of temptation where we will fall and give in to sin. In his grace, God has planned the way towards repentance through confession in order to be forgiven and cleansed of all sin. God provides forgiveness to all people at all times because Christ died and resurrected. He entered the presence of God with an offering of his own blood so that humanity could be purified and forgiven of their sins. If we believe in Him and his healing work, God will forgive our sins.

1. What is forgiveness?

A= Forgiveness is the key to blessing. Forgiveness and repentance open our hearts and allow God's mercy and river to flow openly in us. The meaning of the term 'forgiveness' is to remove the sin from a person.

1 John 1:7 But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin.

• **Note:** When we are forgiven by God, we become special treasure for him and we rest from everything we've carried of pain, anguish, and sadness.

2. Who is the only one who can forgive us?

A= God

Micah 7:18-19 Who is a God like You, pardoning iniquity and passing over the transgression of the remnant of His heritage? He does not retain His anger forever, Because He delights in mercy. **19** He will again have compassion on us, and will subdue our iniquities. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea.

• Note: God is calling all of his creation to a place of repentance and forgiveness. The heavens open as people discover that mercy triumphs over judgement.

3. By what means does God forgive us?

John 3:16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

 Note: The biggest crime committed by humanity was when the Son of God was killed on the cross over two thousand years ago. He endured everything for us because there had to be an expiatory payment for our sins. Because he was innocent, he paid our debt as if he were the one guilty. "Do not waste this great gift."

4. How does forgiveness come to our lives?

A= Confessing our sins to God.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Note: Humanity had a huge debt that was paid through Jesus' sacrifice on the cross (which was the biggest price in the entire universe, which we will return). God, the Son himself, already paid what we owed. Let us sincerely draw near to him and let us plead for forgiveness.

A= Through the sacrifice of his son Jesus Christ. He offered himself for us so that we may be forgiven.

5. What happens to those who are forgiven a lot?

A= Love more

Luke 7:47 Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little.

 Note: The verse previously mentioned speaks about a "sinful" woman who is forgiven a lot and loves a lot. When she found out that Jesus was nearby, she went to him, humbled herself as she washed and kissed his feet (which was something very humbling in the Jewish culture), not caring of what others might say. This is the reason why Jesus Christ forgave all of her sins. If we want to achieve mercy and forgiveness from God the way this "sinful" woman did, then we need to be more like her (follow her example).

6. If God has forgiven us, do we need to forgive our peers?

A= Yes, God motivates us to forgive our peers.

Matthew 6:14-15 *"For if you forgive men their trespasses (failures/offenses), your heavenly Father will also forgive you.* **15** *But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses (failures/offenses)."*

Mark 11:25-26 "And whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him that your Father in heaven may also forgive you your trespasses.
26 But if you do not forgive, neither will your Father in heaven forgive your trespasses."

• Note: If we desire to be in peace with God and with our peers, then we need to learn to forgive those who have hurt us. A simple act of lack of forgiveness can lead a person to spiritual ruin.

7. Did Jesus experiment with forgiveness?

A= Yes

Luke 23:34-35 Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." And they divided His garments and cast lots. 35 And the people stood looking on. But even the rulers with them sneered, saying, "He saved others; let Him save Himself if He is the Christ (the Messiah), the chosen of God."

 Note: Even the Lord who was crucified because of humanity's rebellion had to go through derision (his garments were taken) and in those moments he said "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." In our lives we have passed and will continue to pass difficult moments where we will have to say the same thing Jesus said on the cross.

8. Does the Lord motivate us to forgive each other?

A= Yes, He delights in forgiveness

Ephesians 4:32 And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you.

Colossians 3:13 Bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do.

• Note: Forgiveness will always accompany a good Christian.

9. Is prayer and forgiveness related?

A= Yes

James 5:15 And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven.

• **Note:** Prayer is transformational dialogue with the Heavenly Father. Jesus would make prayer a priority and his moments with the father were valuable and versatile.

• God bless you and remember:

Topic 4. Salvation

4. Salvation

INTRODUCTION

We have seen the previous topic of "Forgiveness" and as a result of that, God gives us "salvation" through his son Jesus Christ.

1. What is salvation?

A= It is deliverance from sin and its consequences.

John 3:16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

• Note: In order for us to be saved, God had to provide a way to be saved, which is what He did through His son Jesus. We need to understand that salvation changes lives. Living hope is the result of having experienced God's salvation.

2. Does God desire for all of humanity to be saved?

A= Yes, He desires it with all his heart.

2 Peter 3:9 The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance.

1 Timothy 2:3-4 For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, **4** who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth.

3. Can we reach salvation only through Jesus Christ?

A= Yes, salvation can only be achieved through Jesus Christ, for he is the one who gave his life for humanity.

Acts 4:12 Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under Heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

1 Timothy 2:5 For there is one God and one Mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus.

 Note: There are people who say that all religions and beliefs lead to God and that we can be saved by following them. However, God says that we can be saved only in the name of Jesus Christ, the Son (salvation is through no one else but Him).

4. How do we acquire salvation?

A= Believing in our Lord Jesus Christ and confessing salvation with our mouths.

Romans 10:10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

 Note: If we want salvation, then we need to believe with our hearts that Jesus Christ died for our sins and we must have genuine repentance as we ask God for forgiveness. We need to confess with our mouths that we are saved because one of Satan's biggest tricks is making believers doubt about their salvation. Let us not fall into his trap.

5. How should we take care of our salvation?

A= With fear and trembling.

Philippians 2:12 Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling.

Hebrews 2:3 How shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation, which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed to us by those who heard Him.

6. How should we fight for our salvation?

A= We fight day after day until the end.

Matthew 24:13 But he who endures to the end shall be saved.

7. Is it impossible to be saved?

A= No, for God nothing is impossible.

Matthew 19:25-26 When His disciples heard it, they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?" **26** But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

 Note: If we have God in our hearts, there is nothing deemed impossible that will stop us from being saved. If we trust in the strength of men, then everything will be impossible. It is necessary to have Jesus in our hearts to achieve salvation.

8. Did Jesus Christ come to judge the World or to save it?

A= To save it. The salvation of the whole World is important to Him.

John 12:47 And if anyone hears My words and does not believe, I do not judge him; for I did not come to judge the world but to save the world.

John 3:17 For God did not send His Son into the World to condemn the world, but that the World through Him might be saved.

• Note: God is not on his throne judging people. Instead He took the shape of a man, gave us His word and died for his love for us.

9. How can our family can be saved?

A= By believing in the Lord Jesus.

Acts 16:30-31 And he brought them out and said, "Sins, what must I do to be saved?" **31** So they said, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household."

• Note: We must remain in the salvation that the Lord Jesus Christ give us, and our testimony will bring our family to eternal salvation.

10. Can we be saved by our works?

A= No, salvation is acquired by giving our lives to Jesus.

Ephesians 2:8-9 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, **9** not of works, lest anyone should boast.

Titus 3:5 Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit.

Note: Imagine if salvation was by works. Every evildoer with money would pay
off all his wrongdoings and would continue to do them. God does not need our
money or our great works. He wants humanity to come to genuine repentance,
and ask God for forgiveness of our sins to finally reach salvation.

11. Did Jesus Christ come to judge the World or to save it?

A= The fragrance of Christ.

2 Corinthians 2:15-16 For we are to God the fragrance of Christ among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing. **16** To the one we are the aroma of death leading to death, and to the other the aroma of life leading to life. And who is sufficient for these things?

 Note: If a person comes to the feet of Jesus, repents, and accepts the salvation of God, the person becomes a fragrant aroma of Christ. However, if this person does not repent and does not become saved, their aroma is of death.

12. Did Jesus Christ come to judge the World or to save it?

A= The fragrance of Christ.

1 Peter 4:18 Now "If the righteous one is scarcely saved, where will the ungodly and the sinner appear?"

• Note: It is not acceptable to play with such a beautiful gift called salvation. God wants us to share it with others so that they can experience the same things as us and enjoy eternal life with Him.

13. What value does salvation need to have for us?

A= It is the best thing any human can have which is why we must treasure it.

Philippians 3:7-9 But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ. **8** Yet indeed, I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ **9** and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which is from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith;

• Note: If we treasure salvation in our hearts, everything else we may have will not have value or prices that could compare to salvation.

14. If we are saved, should we worry about other people's salvation?

A= Yes, we can now be a conduit to other people's salvation.

James 5:20 Let him know that he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save a soul from death and cover a multitude of sins.

- Note: We can be a blessing for many people and take a lot of fruit to the heavens with God. I motivate you to take salvation to all places and be a person that speaks about it.
- God bless you and remember:

Topic 5. The New Birth

5. The New Birth

INTRODUCTION

By natural birth, we enter the position of children in our family. We have become part of divine nature through our spiritual birth which we receive through our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

1. What do we need to be children of God?

A= We need to be born again by believing in Jesus and receiving him in our hearts.

John 1:12 But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name.

• Note: Nicodemus (a leader full of intelligence) went one night to the Lord, and Jesus surprised him by showing him a new birth (John 3:1-21).

John 3:3 Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

2. Was it easy for Nicodemus to understand the new birth?

A= No.

John 3:4-5 Nicodemus said to Him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" **5** Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God.

• Note: To be born again is the act through which a person that was dead spiritually (separated from God) moves on to be spiritually alive (begins to have communion with God). This person becomes a son or daughter of God. Before this, the person was on a route to eternal condemnation, but now their eternal destiny is the house of the Lord.

3. Can we be saved through our works?

A= No. God gave us salvation as a gift. It is not earned by works.

Ephesians 2:8-9 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, **9** not of works, lest anyone should boast.

4. What condemnation is for those who have been saved?

A= None.

Romans 8:1 There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.

• **Note:** We need to seek the things of the Lord to feed our spirit. For example, reading the Bible, talking to God through prayer, and having intimate moments with Him, etc.. It is through this that we will not give an opportunity to the flesh.

5. What happens when we experience the new birth?

A= We are made a new creation.

2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

• Note: Yes, the mechanics of this renovation can be invisible, mysterious, and the effects can be enormous. Yet, all of a sudden, we reach life and proceed to have a harmonic relationship with God (read Romans 5:8-11). Even though many old habits and problems from the Adamic heritage still exist, we continue to feel a new desire to serve, obey, and draw near to God.

6. Why is it important to confess Jesus with our mouth?

A= Because with our mouths we confess to salvation.

Romans 10:9 That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

7. Does Jesus come forced?

A= No.

Revelation 3:20 Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me.

 Note: Jesus desires for the human race to fix their eyes on Him and leave their lifestyles behind. The Lord wants to give us salvation and for that to happen, it is necessary that we open our hearts so that He can help us.

8. Is there transformation when we are born again?

A= Yes.

6. Why do we congregate?

INTRODUCTION

When you congregate, it takes you to spiritual maturity, it will strengthen you and you will be a person that will be able to bless others. However, when you don't congregate, how will you be able to help the ones in need of the love of God?

Hebrews 10:25 Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.

Note: The people who do not congregate tend to motivate others to do the same. However, if you do congregate, you will have a Christian foundation and you will not be moved from your position above the rock.

2. My spiritual life and my family's spiritual life is important to me.

Deuteronomy 6:2 "That you may fear the Lord your God, to keep all His statutes and His commandments which I command you, **you and your son and your grandson**, **all the days of your life**, and that your days may be prolonged."

- When you congregate with a church you will receive a lot, but your family will receive a lot more because they will be giving more of their life to God.
 - Note: Not one person desires for their children to live what they've lived; everyone desires a better life for them which they will find through seeking God. Which is why this should be a motive for congregating in a church.
- 3. To fellowship with the eternal family:

Psalms 133:1 "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!

• There are families which we will fellowship with here on Earth for a couple of years. However, it is a lot more interesting to fellowship with those who will have eternal life because there are eternal plans that are far more important.

• There are times when our family on earth does not want to hear the Gospel, but we need to continue to pray for them so that their hearts can be softened and one day be able to take them to the feet of Jesus. However, we also need to seek a spiritual family with whom we need to fellowship, which can be found where we congregate.

4. To be together in unity to see the miracles of God:

Acts 2:46 So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart.

5. Biblical Examples:

a) Simeon: (Luke 2:25-34).

Simeon	Bible Verse
Was motivated by the Holy Spirit	Luke 2:27: So he came by the Spirit into the temple. And when the parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for Him according to the custom of the law.
His eyes saw salvation	Luke 2:30: For my eyes have seen Your salvation.
Simeon blessed the Lord Jesus	Luke 2:34: Then Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this Child is destined for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign which will be spoken against.

 Note: Imagine if Simeon wouldn't have gathered on that day, he wouldn't have had the blessing of having Jesus in his arms and the opportunity to bless him. The same way, God has a blessing that he will give to us when we gather/ congregate.

b)	Hannah the prophe	t (84 years):	(Luke 2:36-38)
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Hannah the Prophet	Biblical Citation
She was old and a widow, so she had an excuse not to congregate/ gather	Luke 2:36: Now there was one, Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, and had lived with a husband seven years from her virginity.
She was always at the temple in fasting and prayer	Luke 2:37: and this woman was a widow of about eighty-four years, who did not depart from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day.
She saw the Savior with her own eyes, and she began to speak to him	Luke 2:38: And coming in that instant she gave thanks to the Lord, and spoke of Him to all those who looked for redemption in Jerusalem.

• Note: Imagine Hannah using all the excuses she could to not congregate, yet she knew how important it was to congregate, so she received what the Lord had promised to her.

• <u>Conclusion:</u>

When we congregate, we will become very happy to know more about the one who has given us new life. Here, you will experience the presence of God and will be able to fellowship with the new family the Lord has given you. I encourage you to wholeheartedly gather and congregate at a church.

2. The homes and families will smell of the presence of God:

- The presence of God will always be in the homes and families represented.
- There are homes we like to be in because that is where the presence of the Lord is at.

John 12:3 Then Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil.

• Note: This anointing was very valuable and that is how the Presence of God is in the homes, it is a unique value.

3. It promotes fellowship in the Family

5. Receive all who are in need:

6. Homes becomes churches:

Romans 16:5 *Likewise, greet the church that is in their house.* Greet my beloved Epaenetus, who is the first fruits of Achaia to Christ (the occidental providence of Asia Minor).

Colossians 4:15 Greet the brethren who are in Laodicea, and **Nymphas and the** church that is in his house.

<u>Conclusion</u>: I desire with all my heart for you to seek the Lord in small groups (home groups) because it will fill your life and make you into a more productive Christian which will lead you to be of blessing to other generations.

Luke 2:46-47 Now so it was that after three days they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions. **47** And all who heard Him were astonished at His understanding and answers.

2. Because we are thankful with God:

- There were many people who were thankful like Bartimaeus the blind, the demon-possessed Gadarene, Peter's mother-in-law, the leper that returned to Jesus, the Ethiopian, all of them took the message of salvation to a new generation because there was so much gratefulness.
- Jesus exhorts us to do the same.

Matthew 10:7-8 And as you go, preach, saying, 'The kingdom of Heaven is at hand.' 8 Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, and raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give.

- Note: If we have received such beautiful salvation and a new life, then we need to be thankful and give this special moment freely to other people who are living a life without hope and salvation.
- 3. There very few people who want to please God and serve him:
 - Many people have been helped by God, but very few are thankful by serving him

Matthew 9:36-38 But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd. 37 Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. 38 Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest."

• The Lord continues to plea with us, but now we are aware of it.

4. Because errant doctrines are being taught

• If we don't prepare ourselves, we will believe everything we are told. God has left his word so that we can prepare ourselves.

1 Timothy 4:16 Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you.

2 Timothy 3:13-14 But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. 14 But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of, knowing from whom you have learned them.

5. Because we want to leave our thumbprint on the world:

• Apostle Paul leaves us a great example.

2 Timothy 4:6-8 For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure is at hand. **7** I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, and I have kept the faith. **8** Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and **not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing**.

- Apostle Paul will always be remembered as a persecutor of Christians who had an encounter with Jesus. Paul was thankful until the day of his death as he prepared a new generation, which he continues to do because he left a big thumbprint on the World.
- We need to be prepared to leave a legacy behind which means that "even as we leave, we must keep preaching."

• I want to have many talks with my Lord Jesus and I hope that it is for things that I did out of gratefulness.

INTRODUCTION

- This will lead our lives to the perfect will of God, agreeable, and perfect.
- There will not be confusion in our lives.

• <u>Sanctity:</u> Separating ourselves from sin.

1 Thessalonians 4:3 For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you should abstain from sexual immorality.

1 Peter 2:15-16 For this is the will of God, that by doing good you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men— **16** as free, yet not using liberty as a cloak for vice, but as bondservants of God.

The perfect will of God is the sanctity of his children and his church.

Ephesians 5:27 That He might present her to Himself **a glorious church**, not having **spot or wrinkle or any such thing**, but that she should be holy and without blemish.

4. Being grateful is the perfect will of God:

1 Thessalonians 5:18 In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

- They do not enter into worship, only in the message.
