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Topic 1. Fasting

1. Fasting

1. What is fasting?

A= Fasting refers to abstaining from food. For Christians, fasting is the act of giving life to the spirit while weakening the flesh.

2. Did Jesus recommend fasting?

A= Yes. One of the examples is in **Matthew 17** when the disciples could not drive out a demon from a possessed boy.

Matthew 17:19-21 *Then the disciples came to Jesus privately and said, "Why could we not cast it out?" 20 So Jesus said to them, "Because of your unbelief; for assuredly, I say to you, if you have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you. 21 However, this kind does not go out except by prayer and fasting."*

- **Note:** The Lord Jesus recommends fasting but always along with faith and prayer.

3. What are some types of fasting inspired by God? A=

Character	Days	Bible verse
Jesus	40 days	Matthew 4:2 And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterward He was hungry.
Moses	40 days	Exodus 34:28 ^{so} he was there with the LORD forty days and forty nights; he neither ate bread nor drank water. And He wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the ^[d] Ten Commandments.

Elijah	40 days	1 Kings 19:8 So he arose, and ate and drank; and he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights as far as Horeb, the mountain of God.
Paul	Varies	2 Corinthians 6:4-5 But in all <i>things</i> we commend ourselves as ministers of God: in much ^[a] patience, in tribulations, in needs, in distresses, ⁵ in stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labors, in sleeplessness, in fasting
Daniel	21 days	Daniel 10:2-3 In those days I, Daniel, was mourning three full weeks. ³ I ate no pleasant food, no meat or wine came into my mouth, nor did I anoint myself at all, till three whole weeks were fulfilled.

4. What changes does fasting produce?

A= Fasting makes God’s hand move and thus see his mercy.

- We find an example of God’s hand moving in mercy in the book of Jonah with the people of Nineveh.

Jonah 3:5 *So the people of Nineveh believed God, proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least of them.*

Jonah 3:10 *Then God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God relented from the disaster that He had said He would bring upon them, and He did not do it.*

- **Note:** The Lord was filled with mercy and thus the people and king were spared from the destruction.
- Example in the times of the prophet Daniel.

Daniel 6:18 *Now the king went to his palace and **spent the night fasting**; and no musicians were brought before him. Also his sleep went from him.*

- **Note:** Darius did not believe in God but fasted out of love for Daniel. God delivered Daniel from the lions. After seeing this, Darius made a decree that in every dominion of his kingdom, men must tremble and fear before the God of Daniel (Dan. 6:26).

5. Is it true that the combination of fasting and prayer produces revelation?

A= Yes.

Acts 10:30 *So Cornelius said, “Four days ago I was fasting until this hour; and at the ninth hour I prayed in my house, and behold, a man stood before me in bright clothing,*

- **Note:** Cornelius was a devout man who constantly fasted and prayed and he received revelation from God. Praying and fasting wholeheartedly will lead to intimate revelations about God.

6. Is it possible for our fast to not be heard or seen by God?

A= Yes, a clear example of this is the story Jesus tells in Luke about the pharisee.

Luke 18:12 *‘I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.’*

- **Note:** Even though the pharisee fasted twice a week and gave tithes, his prayer was not heard due to his pride and arrogance. We have to make sure that when we fast, our motives are not selfish. Our fast must be accompanied by the right attitude and obedience.

Matthew 6:16-18 *“Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. ¹⁷ But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your*

Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly.

7. What kind of fast does God want from us?

A= In **Isaiah 58** we find the kind of fasting that pleases God (reflect on this passage)

- Not going after our own pleasures (doing what we please)
- Avoiding quarreling and strife
- Humbling ourselves and bowing our heads down
- To loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, to let the oppressed go free
- To share your bread with the hungry and to clothe the naked

Isaiah 58:11 *The LORD will guide you continually, and satisfy your soul in drought, and strengthen your bones; You shall be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water, whose waters do not fail.*

- **Note:** Always seek to fast in order to prosper spiritually and help others. Avoid strife and you will see that the Lord will prosper you in all aspects of your life.

8. What are some of the goals of fasting? A=

- To intercede for our family.
- To humble ourselves in the midst of difficult and discouraging times.
- To seek wisdom and do God's will.
- To ask for revival in the church.
- To intercede for those who do not know Christ.
- To seek forgiveness when we've failed God.

- **Note:** Fasting is a sacrifice that is offered to God and is dependent upon the heart of the person offering such sacrifice. The fast can be done for half of a day, an entire day, three days, or even more days as long as God is the one guiding you and there is a divine purpose. Fasting can be done individually, among a small group of people, or as a congregation.

Topic 2.

Tithes and Offerings

2. Tithes and Offerings

INTRODUCTION

We need to recognize that God is the absolute owner of everything that exists and therefore He does not need our money. He has established his kingdom on earth with the purpose of increasing it. Tithing and offering are acts of obedience and faith that God uses to increase the Kingdom of Heaven on earth. God delights in the cheerful giver who, ungrudgingly, tithes and gives offering out of the 90% that he/she has left.

2 Corinthians 9:7 *So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.*

1. What is the tithe?

A= The tithe is the 10 percent of our income. In the Kingdom of God, it is giving back to God what is rightly his and knowing that he always blesses our obedience.

Malachi 3:10 *"Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house, and try me now in this," says the Lord of hosts, "If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing That there will not be room enough to receive it.*

2. Why should we tithe?

A= Because God instituted tithing as a way of worship.

Deuteronomy 14:22-23 *You shall truly tithe all the increase of your grain that the field produces year by year. 23 And you shall eat before the Lord your God, in the place where He chooses to make His name abide, the tithe of your grain and your new wine and your oil, of the firstborn of your herds and your flocks, that you may learn to fear the Lord your God always.*

3. What do we get from tithing?

A= 7 blessings

Malachi 3:10-12 *Bring all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house, and try Me now in this,” Says the Lord of hosts, “If I will not open for you the windows of heaven and pour out for you such blessing That there will not be room enough to receive it. 11 “And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, so that he will not destroy the fruit of your ground, nor shall the vine fail to bear fruit for you in the field,” Says the Lord of hosts; 12 “And all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a delightful land,” Says the Lord of hosts.*

Ordinance	Blessing
1. Bring all the tithes into the storehouse	To the local church
2. There may be food	Spiritual and physical food
3. Try me	God inviting us to try him
4. Open the windows of heaven	Windows of blessings
5. Pour out blessing	Abundance
6. Rebuke the devourer	Spiritually and financially
7. Call you blessed	Name received as a result of our obedience

- **Note:** God wants you to have these 7 blessings in your life. He wants you to see that he is an omnipotent God. These blessings, however, are dependent upon our obedience. He is the one who opens the doors for us and the one who rebukes the devourer.

4. Is God impoverished if we do not tithe?

A= No, God owns everything

God’s ownership	Bible Verse
The heavens and the earth	Genesis 1:1 <i>In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth</i>

Owner of silver and gold	Haggai 2:8 <i>The silver is Mine, and the gold is Mine, ' says the Lord of hosts.</i>
Humankind	Romans 14:8 <i>For if we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. Therefore, whether we live or dies, we are of the Lord's.</i>

5. Where should we take our tithe?

A= To the storehouse

- **Note:** The word “storehouse” refers to a place such as barn where things, typically food, were stored and when needed withdrawn from. The storehouse **represents our local church** for it is from there that we obtain our spiritual food. Our church is, therefore, the place where we should take our tithe.

6. Did people in the Old Testament tithe?

A= Yes.

Character	Bible Verse
Abraham	Genesis 14:20 <i>“And blessed be God Most High Who has delivered your enemies into your hand.” And he gave him a tithe of all.</i>
Jacob	Genesis 28:20-22 <i>Then Jacob made a vow, saying, “If God will be with me, and keep me in this way that I am going, and give me bread to eat and clothing to put on, 21 so that I come back to my father’s house in peace, then the Lord shall be my God. 22 And this stone which I have set as a pillar shall be God’s house, and of all that You give me I will surely give a tenth to You.”</i>
The People	Leviticus 27:30 <i>'And all the tithe of the land, whether, of seed of the land or of the fruit of the tree, is the Lord's. It is holy to the Lord.</i>

7. What is the offering?

A= The offering is what we wholeheartedly give to God from the 90% we have left after we give our tithe.

2 Corinthians 8:3-4 *“For I bear witness that according to their ability, yes, and beyond their ability, they were freely willing 4 imploring us with much urgency that we would receive the gift and the fellowship of the ministering to the saints.”*

8. What happens if we do not tithe or give offerings?

A= We would be stopping the expansion of the Kingdom of God and we would be bringing curse to ourselves.

Malachi 3:8-9 *“Will a man rob God? Yet you have robbed Me! But you say, ‘In what way have we robbed You?’ In tithes and offerings. 9 You are cursed with a curse, for you have robbed Me, Even this whole nation.”*

- **Note:** Remember, God does not need our money. He wants us to be obedient to bless us.

9. Does Jesus talk about tithing and offerings?

A= Yes, Jesus encourages us to tithe and give offering because he wants to expand his kingdom and wants to bless us.

Matthew 22:21 *They said to Him, “Caesar’s.” And He said to them, “Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar’s, and to God the things that are God’s.”*

Luke 11:42 *“But woe to you Pharisees! For you tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass by justice and the love of God. These you ought to have done, without leaving the others undone.”*

- **Note:** Here, the Lord Jesus acknowledged that the pharisees were obedient in strictly giving the tithe. Jesus was not against the pharisees tithing. He encouraged them to continue tithing AND to act in justice and love.

10. Can be borrow from the tithe we are to give?

A= Yes, but you must add 20% to it.

Leviticus 27:31 *If a man wants at all to redeem any of his tithes, he shall add one-fifth to it.*

- **Note:** God wants to bless us and is our partner. If we want to take from what is his, then we must redeem the original amount and pay an additional 20% (more or less one-fifth). God placed this high interest so that we would not get used to taking from the tithe. Many Christians borrow from the tithe and do not give the additional 20% which results in increasing debt. I encourage you to not fall in this trap and be wise stewards.

Topic 3. Faith

3. Faith

1. What is faith?

A= **Hebrews 11:1** *Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen*

- **Note:** Faith in God is believing that He exists, believing in his Word (the Bible), and believing that Christ will return for his church. We understand that the “church” refers to everyone who repents from his or her sins and gives his/her heart to Jesus.

2. Is it by faith that we believe that God created everything?

A= Yes.

Hebrews 11:3 *By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.*

3. What does God think about a faithless individual?

A= A person without faith cannot please God.

Hebrews 11:6 *But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.*

Hebrews 11:38-40 *of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. 39 And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, 40 God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us.*

4. Why is Abraham called the “father of faith”?

A= Abraham is known as the father of faith because he believed God and obeyed him.

- **Note:** I invite you to read about the life of Abraham in Genesis 12-25.

Hebrews 11:8 *By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to the place which he would receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. 9 By faith he dwelt in the land of promise as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise;*

- **Note:** Abraham learned to live by faith and that's why he is known as the father of faith. The Bible tells us that he lived as a foreigner, waiting for the heavenly city God has designed.

Hebrews 11:18-19 *... of whom it was said, "In Isaac your seed shall be called," 19 concluding that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead, from which he also received him in a figurative sense.*

- **Note:** Abraham demonstrated to us how we should live. Abraham proved a great faith when he trusted God with his son, Isaac. Perhaps, Abraham believed that God would, if needed, raise Isaac from the dead. The Bible tells us that Abraham is not only called "The father of faith" but God also calls him a friend.

Hebrews 11:16 *But now they desire a better, that is, a heavenly country. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He has prepared a city for them.*

5. Does our faith get tested?

A= Yes. **James 1:1-3** *James, a bondservant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes which are scattered abroad: Greetings. 2 My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, 3 knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience.*

6. How much faith is required of us?

A= On a minimum we should have faith the size of a mustard seed

Matthew 17:20 *So Jesus said to them, "Because of your unbelief; for assuredly, I say to you, if you have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you.*

- **Note:** The mustard seed is the smallest of all seeds but when it grows, it becomes a great and strong plant. That's exactly how our faith should grow to be.

Proverbs 3:5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding.

7. What is the result of faith?

A= **Romans 8:28** *And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose.*

8. Is there anything that can destroy our faith?

A= Nothing has the power to destroy our faith.

Romans 8:37-39 *Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. 38 For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, 39 nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

9. What can we do to increase our faith?

A= Believe in God and his Word.

Mark 9:23 *Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes."*

- **Note:** God is our provider and the source of everything. He asks of us to have faith and to not worry about anything.

10. From where or whom do we derive our sense of direction and guidance in life?

A= Jesus Christ.

Matthew 6:31-33 *“Therefore do not worry, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ 32 For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. 33 But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.*

- **Note:** The Lord Jesus loves us since eternity and to eternity. He knows all of our needs and only asks that we believe Him. He has promised to be with us even to the end of the age (**Matthew 28:20**).

4. Abundant Life

1. What does Jesus teach about having an abundant life?

A= Jesus taught that he came to give us life, an abundant life.

John 10:9-10 *I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture. 10 The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly.*

2. What is God's desire for believers in regards to joy?

A= To rejoice.

Philippians 4:4 *Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice!*

3. Where was Paul when he wrote to the Philippians?

A= In prison.

Philippians 1:13 *so that it has become evident to the whole palace guard, and to all the rest, that my chains are in Christ;*

4. Did Jesus rejoice?

A= Yes, Jesus rejoiced in the Spirit.

Luke 10:21 *In that hour Jesus rejoiced in the Spirit and said, "I thank You, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that You have hidden these things from the wise and prudent and revealed them to babes. Even so, Father, for so it seemed good in Your sight.*

5. Should we rejoice in the second coming of the Lord Jesus?

A= Yes.

John 14:28 *You have heard Me say to you, 'I am going away and coming back to you.' If you loved Me, you would rejoice because I said, 'I am going to the Father,' for My Father is greater than I.*

6. When do we begin to experience the joy of an abundant life?

A= Since we give our heart and life to Jesus.

2 Corinthians 5:17 *Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.*

7. Does the Lord give an abundant spiritual life as well?

A= Yes.

Ephesians 6:13 *Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.*

8. What is the armor of God? A=

Armor	Meaning
Shield	Faith
Belt	Truth
Breastplate	Righteousness
Helmet	Salvation
Shoes	Gospel of Peace
Sword	The Word of God

- **Note:** God wants us to rejoice and has given us a spiritual armor to defeat everything that comes against us. It is through the successful use of the armor that we can experience joy in the midst of our circumstances.

Ephesians 6:18 *Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints*

- **Note:** Take the armor and rejoice tearing down the works of the devil and the devil himself in the name of Jesus Christ.
 - Rejoice presenting yourself approved to God.
 - Rejoice rescuing souls for Christ.
 - Rejoice in knowing that your name has been written in the book of life.
 - Rejoice that the demons are subject to Jesus Christ.
 - Rejoice in knowing that your father is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.
 - Rejoice in eternal life.
- **Note:** There's a song that says "Jesus you are the reason I live" and that's the way it should be. Jesus in us is joy, the joy of his second coming. For one day we will be eternally reunited with him and rejoicing.

5. Divine Healing

INTRODUCTION

Divine healing refers to Christ's ministry to heal the sick and afflicted through prayer.

1. Does our body belong to God?

A= Yes, just like our soul and spirit.

1 Corinthians 6:20 *For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's*

2. What is the origin of sickness and death?

A= Sin and the fall of mankind (Adam and Eve)

- **Note:** Mankind was made in the image of God and destined to live an eternal life. It was never God's plan for humanity to go through suffering (physical and emotional). Do not forget that: "God created man in His *own* image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them" (**Genesis 1:27**, NKJV).

3. Did death and sickness also come as a result of sin?

A= Yes.

Romans 5:12 *Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned.*

4. Who is the agent of sickness?

A= Satan.

Job 2:6-7 *And the Lord said to Satan, “Behold, he is in your hand, but spare his life.” 7 So Satan went out from the presence of the Lord, and struck Job with painful boils from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head.*

- **Note:** We know that God showed Satan that Job loved him in spite of the circumstances. God not only prospered and healed Job, but he gave him back everything he initially had and more.

Luke 13:16 *“So ought not this woman, being a daughter of Abraham, whom Satan has bound—think of it—for eighteen years, be loosed from this bond on the Sabbath?”*

5. Does every illness come from the devil?

A= No. We must remember that our body has a beginning and an end.

2 Corinthians 4:16 *Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward man is being renewed day by day.*

6. Were there Bible characters who experienced sickness?

A= Yes.

Character	Bible Verse
Elisha (Died of this illness)	2 Kings 13:14 <i>Elisha had become sick with the illness of which he would die. Then Joash the king of Israel came down to him, and wept over his face, and said, “O my father, my father, the chariots of Israel and their horsemen!”</i>

Job (Scabies)	Job 2:6-7 <i>And the Lord said to Satan, “Behold, he is in your hand, but spare his life.” 7 So Satan went out from the presence of the Lord, and struck Job with painful boils from the sole of his foot to the crown of his head.</i>
Paul (A thorn in the flesh)	2 Corinthians 12:7-9 <i>And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. 8 Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. 9 And He said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.” Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.</i>
Timothy (Stomach ache)	1 Timothy 5:23 <i>No longer drink only water, but use a little wine for your stomach’s sake and your frequent infirmities.</i>
Trophimus (left in Miletus sick)	2 Timothy 4:20 <i>Erastus stayed in Corinth, but Trophimus I have left in Miletus sick.</i>

- **Note:** Without a shadow of a doubt, God has a plan for our lives. However, as we can in the lives of these bible characters, sometimes illnesses are part of our lives.

7. Where can we find the covenant of divine healing that was given to Israel?

A= In Exodus.

Exodus 15:26 *and said, “If you diligently heed the voice of the Lord your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. **For I am the Lord who heals you.**”*

8. What did Isaiah prophesy 700 years before Christ?

A= The moments in which Jesus Christ would pay for our illnesses.

Isaiah 53:4-5 *Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted. 5 But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed.*

9. Was the prophecy fulfilled?

A= Yes.

Matthew 8:16-17 *When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, 17 that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: “**He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses.**”*

10. How many healing miracles did Jesus perform? A=

Healings
26 cases of individual healing
10 cases of collective healing
7 cases of healing everyone who was present

Matthew 8:16 *When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and **healed all who were sick.***

Matthew 9:35 *Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and **healing every sickness and every disease among the people.***

Matthew 12:15 *But when Jesus knew it, He withdrew from there. And great multitudes followed Him, and **He healed them all.***

11. Did the apostles perform healing miracles?

A= Yes.

Acts 5:15-16 *so that they brought the sick out into the streets and laid them on beds and couches, that at least the shadow of Peter passing by might fall on some of them. **16** Also a multitude gathered from the surrounding cities to Jerusalem, bringing sick people and those who were tormented by unclean spirits, **and they were all healed.***

12. Did the apostles raise people from the dead?

A= Yes.

Acts 9:40 *But Peter put them all out, and knelt down and prayed. And turning to **the body he said, “Tabitha, arise.”** And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up.*

13. Did the apostle Paul perform miracles?

A= Yes.

Acts 19:11-12 *Now God worked unusual miracles by the hands of Paul, **12** so that even handkerchiefs or aprons were brought from his body to the sick, and the diseases left them and the evil spirits went out of them.*

14. Where can we find God's promise to us about divine healing?

A= **Mark 16:17-18** *And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues; 18 they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; **they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.***"

15. What can we do when someone is sick?

A=

- Pray for him/her (ask the church leaders)
- Anoint him/her with oil
- Pray in the name of Jesus
- Have faith

James 5:13-14 *Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms. 14 Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord.*

- **Note:** A prayer of faith will save and raise the sick. If that person has committed sins, he will be forgiven.

The Lord's Supper

6. The Lord's Supper

1. What is the Lord's Supper?

A= It's a celebration in which we remember the death and sacrifice of our Lord Jesus Christ at the cross of Calvary. The Lord's Supper is also known as the Feast of Passover.

Luke 22:19-20 *And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me." 20 Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you.*

2. Where does this celebration come from?

A= From the time the people of Israel were in Egypt.

Exodus 12:11 *And thus you shall eat it: with a belt on your waist, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. So you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover.*

- **Note:** This celebration took place in Egypt after the death of all firstborn. Each Jewish home was to kill a lamb, take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the house. The flesh of the sacrificed lamb was to be eaten that night. This act was a sign for God to pass over the house and not kill the firstborn of that household. For the Jewish people, this feast was a memorial of their freedom.

3. What's the meaning of the Passover?

A= For God's people (Israel), it was a reminder and celebration of their freedom and God's help.

4. Where can we find the institution of the Passover?

A= **Exodus 12:14** *'So this day shall be to you a memorial; and you shall keep it as a feast to the Lord throughout your generations. You shall keep it as a feast by an everlasting ordinance.'*

5. Did Jesus celebrate the Jewish Passover?

A= Yes.

Luke 22:14-16 *When the hour had come, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him. 15 Then He said to them, "With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; 16 for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."*

- **Note:** The Passover was the first of three major Jewish festivals. It was expected for all Jews to present themselves at the temple.

6. What does the bread represent?

A= The body of Christ.

Luke 22:19 *And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me."*

7. What does the wine represent?

A= The blood of Christ (The new covenant).

Luke 22:20 *Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you."*

8. What is the Apostle Paul's recommendation about our conduct when taking the Lord's Supper?

A= Paul condemned any type of abuse at the Lord's Supper.

1 Corinthians 11:20-22 *Therefore when you come together in one place, it is not to eat the Lord's Supper. 21 For in eating, each one takes his own supper ahead of others; and one is hungry and another is drunk. 22 What! Do you not have houses to eat and drink in? Or do you despise the church of God and shame [c]those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you in this? I do not praise you.*

- **Note:** The Apostle Paul was referring to the common practice of holding a fraternal (agape) dinner before The Lord's Supper. It seems like, the church had abused this gathering and the people began drinking and eating irresponsibly.

9. What attitude should we have when celebrating The Lord's Supper?

A= We should come reverently, examining ourselves and discerning the Lord's body.

1 Corinthians 11:28-29 *But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. 29 For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.*

- **Note:** To reverently participate in this celebration is to recognize and value Christ's sacrifice at the Calvary cross and to boldly seek his forgiveness and mercy.

10. How often should we celebrate the Lord's Supper?

A= As often as necessary until the return of our Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Corinthians 11:26 *For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.*

7. The Second Coming of Jesus Christ

1. What is the holy hope of the church?

A= The second coming of Jesus Christ.

- **Note:** Every time we partake in the Lord's Supper, we do it in remembrance of him and his redemptive work.

1 Thessalonians 4:16-17 *For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord.*

2. What did Jesus promise before ascending to heaven?

A= That he would come back.

Acts 1:9-11 *Now when He had spoken these things, while they watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight. 10 And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel, 11 who also said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven."*

3. Why did Jesus go back to the Father?

A= He went to prepare special places for us.

John 14:2-3 *In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also.*

4. When will Jesus return?

A= Only the Father knows.

Matthew 24:36 *“But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, but My Father only.*

Matthew 24:44 *Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.*

5. What signs will there be of his return?

A= There will be great signs such as rumors of wars, famine, and earthquakes.

Matthew 24:5-8 *For many will come in My name, saying, ‘I am the Christ,’ and will deceive many. 6 And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not troubled; for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet. 7 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. And there will be famines, pestilences, and earthquakes in various places. 8 All these are the beginning of sorrows.*

- **Many will come in his name:**

Nowadays, sorcerers, soothsayers, psychics, sect leaders, and fortune tellers use the name of Jesus to deceive people (knowing that God hates all of this). Jesus is the way, the truth and the life (**John 14:6**).

- **Wars:**

Every day there are new wars breaking out and rumors of wars. It is enough to turn on the television, listen to the radio, or go to social media to see that this is true.

6. What will all of these signs cause?

A= Discouragement among many people.

Matthew 24:12-13 *And because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold. 13 But he who endures to the end shall be saved.*

7. Will there be diseases and plagues?

A= Yes.

- HIV/AIDS: Humanity has a long history of prostitution and substance abuse but it wasn't until recently that HIV was introduced. As we know, this virus can lead to the incurable and contagious condition called AIDS. With an increase of sexual immorality and drug addiction in today's society, many more people are at risk of being infected with this terrible virus. The best thing we can do is to start a life with Christ.
- Plagues: Humankind has polluted the environment in such an aggressive way that has brought forth many kinds of plagues.

8. What other signs will there be of the second coming of the Lord? A=

- The restoration of Israel.
- In 1948 the state of Israel is established.
- In 1967 Jerusalem is under Jewish control for the first time in 2000 years (since the siege of Jerusalem in 586 B.C. by Nebuchadnezzar).

Matthew 24:32 *Now learn this parable from the fig tree: When its branch has already become tender and puts forth leaves, you know that summer is near.*

- **Note:** The Second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ is near. Prophecies such as the following one are being fulfilled:

Matthew 24:14: *"And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come."*

- **Note:** Today, the Gospel is preached all over the world. The Bible has been translated into many languages and even dialects. The fall of many communist countries has allowed the Word of God to enter those difficult places.

Based on the previous discussion, I encourage you to give your heart and life to the Lord Jesus. Today he is our advocate and savior but one day he will be our just judge.

1. What are the different types of antichrist?

A=

Types	Bible Verse
Antichrists	1 John 2:18 <i>Little children, it is the last hour; and as you have heard that the Antichrist is coming, even now many antichrists have come, by which we know that it is the last hour.</i>
The antichrist	2 Thessalonians 2:3 <i>Let no one deceive you by any means; for that Day will not come unless the falling away comes first, and the man of sin is revealed, the son of perdition,</i>
The spirit of the antichrist	1 John 4:3 <i>and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the spirit of the Antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world.</i>

2. What is the definition of the antichrists?

A= Anyone or anything that opposes Christ.

- **Note:** anyone who opposes Jesús as the Christ is considered an antichrist. Through history there have been people who refused to acknowledge Jesus as the Christ and John called them antichrists.

1 John 2:18 *Little children, it is the last hour; and as you have heard that the Antichrist is coming, even now many antichrists have come, by which we know that it is the last hour.*

- Example of antichrists throughout history

Example	Year	Event	Bible Verse
Antiochus Epiphanes	167 B.C.	Defiled the temple by erecting a statue of the Greek god Zeus and sacrificing a pig	Daniel 11:31 <i>"And forces shall be mustered by him, and they shall defile the sanctuary fortress; then they shall take away the daily sacrifices, and place there the abomination of desolation."</i>
Caligula	37 - 41 A.D.	He ordered to have statues of himself set up in the Jewish Temple in Jerusalem	History
Domitian	81- 96 A.D.	Persecution of the early church	History

3. What is the definition of the Antichrist?

A= Someone who opposes and exalts himself above all that is called God and demands to be worshipped.

- Man of sin
- Son of perdition
- Wicked man

2 Thessalonians 2:3 *Let no one deceive you by any means; for that Day will not come unless the falling away comes first, and the man of sin is revealed, the son of perdition*

- The following are characteristics of the antichrist:

Characteristic	Bible Verse
He will oppose God and will call himself God	2 Thessalonians 2:4 <i>who opposes and exalts himself above all that is called God or that is worshiped, so that he sits as God in the temple of God, showing himself that he is God.</i>
Satan will back him with power, signs and lying wonders	2 Thessalonians 2:9 <i>The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders</i>
He will rule with a political-religious system	Revelation 13:4-6 <i>So they worshiped the dragon who gave authority to the beast; and they worshiped the beast, saying, "Who is like the beast? Who is able to make war with him?"</i> 5 And he was given a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies, and he was given authority to continue for forty-two months. 6 Then he opened his mouth in blasphemy against God, to blaspheme His name, His tabernacle, and those who dwell in heaven.
He will be a world dictator invested with the power of Satan	Revelation 13:7 <i>It was granted to him to make war with the saints and to overcome them. And authority was given him over every tribe, tongue, and nation.</i>

4. What is the definition of the spirit of the antichrist?

A= any spirit that does not confess Jesus as coming in the flesh.

- **Note:** It is a manipulative demon that tricks the human mind. He will deceive many religious groups and will lead them to denying Jesus as Christ and Savior.

1 John 4:3 *and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is not of God. And **this is the spirit of the Antichrist**, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world.*

2 John 1:7 *For many deceivers have gone out into the world who do not confess Jesus Christ as coming in the flesh. **This is a deceiver and an antichrist.***

- **Note:** This demon has been deceiving people for the last 2000 years and has prepared the way for the son of perdition (the antichrist).

5. What is stopping the manifestation of the antichrist?

A= The Holy Spirit which dwells in us. However, when Christ comes back for his people, the Holy Spirit will also return to God.

2 Thessalonians 2:7 *For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He who now restrains **will do so** until He is taken out of the way.*

- **Note:** After this, the antichrist will be manifested and his reign will deceive many people. He will control his people by marking them with the number 666. This will mark the beginning of the greatest human tragedy (the Great Tribulation) during which those who do not recognize the antichrist as king and god will be killed.

6. What will be the end of the antichrist?

A= He will only reign for seven years for at due time, Jesus will come back and defeat him with his sword (the power of his Word) and all of his army. The antichrist will be cast into the lake of fire.

Daniel 7:25 *'He shall speak pompous words against the Most High, Shall persecute the saints of the Most High, And shall intend to change times and law. Then the saints shall be given into his hand For a time and times and half a time.*

Revelation 19:19-20 *And I saw the beast, the kings of the earth, and their armies, gathered together to make war against Him who sat on the horse and against His army. 20 Then the beast was captured, and with him the false prophet who worked signs in his presence, by which he deceived those who received the mark of the beast and those who worshiped his image. These two were cast alive into the lake of fire burning with brimstone.*

- **Note:** Would you like to be live during that dark period of time? If you do not, give your life to the Lord Jesus. Rather than suffering, you will rejoice at the marriage supper of the Lamb (Revelation 19:6-9).

INTRODUCTION

This refers to the last events or signs, natural and spiritual, that will be mark the end of times:

The Rapture
Presence of the Antichrist
The false prophet
666 (mark of the beast)
Armageddon
The Millennial
Final Judgment

1. What is the Rapture?

A= An event in which the sons and daughters of God, the church, will rise (be raptured) into heaven and join Christ in the clouds. It is believed that our body will be transformed into an incorruptible one (like Christ's) to meet with him.

1 Corinthians 15:52 *in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.*

1 Thessalonians 4:16-17 *For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. 17 Then we who are alive and remain **shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air.** And thus we shall always be with the Lord.*

Acts 1:11 *who also said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven."*

2. Who is the antichrist?

A= Character that will rise as a political-religious leader and will become a world dictator. He will oppose God and will bring a major human tragedy.

2 Thessalonians 2:9-10 *The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders, 10 and with all unrighteous deception among those who perish, because they did not receive the love of the truth, that they might be saved.*

3. Who is the false prophet?

A= Religious leader that will support the government of the antichrist through his doctrine. He will use God's temple to worship the antichrist as the Messiah. His mark will be similar to a lamb (a symbol of Jewish priesthood) and will do great miracles and wonders through satanic power.

Revelation 13:11-13 *Then I saw another beast coming up out of the earth, and he had two horns like a lamb and spoke like a dragon. 12 And he exercises all the authority of the first beast in his presence, and causes the earth and those who dwell in it to worship the first beast, whose deadly wound was healed. 13 He performs great signs, so that he even makes fire come down from heaven on the earth in the sight of men.*

4. What is the meaning of the number 666 (the mark of the beast)?

A= It's the number of the antichrist which will be stamped on people's right hand or on their forehead during his reign. This means that the people are surrendering to and serving the antichrist.

Revelation 13:18 *Here is wisdom. Let him who has understanding calculate the number of the beast, for it is the number of a man: His number is 666.*

- **Note:** The people that accept the mark of the beast will not be saved. The mark of the beast will not necessarily be three consecutive 6's but any type of code such as a barcode or microchip.

5. What is the Armageddon?

A= A place where all the kingdoms and nations will gather to fight against Jesus. It will be a physical and spiritual battle field where Jesus will defeat Satan.

Revelation 16:16 *And they gathered them together to the place called in Hebrew, Armageddon.*

6. What is the Millennial (one thousand years)?

A= A period of peace, love and fraternity just as it was intended to be in the garden of Eden (**Isaiah 11:6-9**). Christ will rule the world. All the nations will gather in Jerusalem to be under his leadership. During this time Satan will be contained.

Revelation 20:2-3 He laid hold of the dragon, that serpent of old, who is *the* Devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years; **3** and he cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal on him, so that he should deceive the nations **no more till the thousand years** were finished. But after these things he must be released for a little while.

- **Note:** During the 1000 years that Satan is bounded, the Millennial will be experienced on earth with our Lord Jesus.

7. What is the final judgment?

A= Also known as the Great White Throne Judgment. It will be a judgment for those who rejected Christ as savior and will receive eternal condemnation.

Revelation 20:15 And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire.

- **Note:** God's children will not be judged but will judge alongside of Him. God's plan is not to instill fear but to let humanity know that there will be a time of judgment. The intention is to motivate us to seek him and avoid the consequence of sin, eternal suffering.

10. The Final Judgment

1. Will we see God face to face?

A= Yes. The people who rejected Jesus will live apart from God for eternity but those who accepted him will live with him for eternity.

- **Note:** Those who personally know Jesus will be excited to finally be with him (**Revelation 20:6**).

Hebrews 9:27 *And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment...*

A= **John 5:28-29** *Do not marvel at this; for the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice 29 and come forth—those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation.*

4. When and where will the believer be judged for his/her sins?

A=

Romans 8:1 *There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.*

John 5:24 *Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.*

Revelation 2:11 *“He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. He who overcomes shall not be hurt by the second death.”*

2 Corinthians 5:10 *For we must all appear before the **judgment seat of Christ**, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad.*

- **Note:** Every believer will appear before the judgment seat of Christ. Remember that the judgment seat of Christ is for rewards not to determine whether the believer is going to hell or heaven.

5. What is the difference between the judgment seat of Christ and the final judgment?

A=

- Judgment Seat of Christ: judgment that God will hold for believers to reward their actions.

Romans 14:10-13 *But why do you judge your brother? Or why do you show contempt for your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. 11 For it is written: “As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God.” 12 So then each of us shall give account of himself to God. 13 Therefore let us not judge one another anymore, but rather resolve this, not to put a stumbling block or a cause to fall in our brother’s way.*

- The Final Judgment: Judgment held for non-believers; eternal condemnation.

Revelation 20:15 *And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire.*

6. Who will appear at the Great White Throne Judgment?

A= God.

Revelation 20:11 *Then I saw a great white throne and Him who sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away. And there was found no place for them.*

7. Who will be judged?

A= Those who did not believe God’s message.

Revelation 20:12 *And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is the Book of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books.*

Revelation 20:15 *And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire.*

- **Note:** Jesus will be the judge (**John 5:27**). The people who rejected Jesus will be separated from God.
- **Conclusion:** Do not undervalue the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. Instead, accept him as Lord and Savior.

I love you in the love of Jesus Christ and I encourage you to press on. Maybe here on earth I will never have the opportunity to meet you but, by faith, I will see you in heaven. I look forward to meeting you, giving you a warm hug and telling you: “It was worth following Christ.” Remember, there is an eternal life with Jesus and there is an eternal life in the lake of fire: **Choose Jesus.**
