2. Stewardship of Talents

INTRODUCTION

The Stewardship (administration) of the talents that God has given us, are to be utilized in His Kingdom, whether they are spiritual or natural.

1. What are talents?

A= Spiritual and natural gifts that God has given us to be used.

2. The parable of the talents:

Matthew 25:14-17 "¹⁴ "For the kingdom of heaven is like a man traveling to a far country, who called his own servants and delivered his goods to them. ¹⁵ And to one he gave five talents, to another two, and to another one, to each according to his own ability; and immediately he went on a journey.¹⁶ Then he who had received the five talents went and traded with them, and made another five talents. ¹⁷ And likewise he who had received two gained two more also.

Characteristics:

- **5 talents:** made another 5 talents (Faithful servant, walking in the joy of the Lord)
- **2 talents:** made another 2 talents (Faithful servant, walking in the joy of the Lord)
- Note: They were considered faithful servants and in the joy of the Lord they went; they were faithful in the least and were put over many things. In the same way when we participate in using our talents, even if they seem insignificant, God values them; we will be faithful and walk in the joy of the Lord.

• **1 Talent:** Hid the talent (blaming his owner; he was afraid; he hid it)

Matthew 25:24-28 ²⁴ He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed, ²⁵ so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here, you have what is yours.' ²⁶ But his master answered him, 'You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I scattered no seed? ²⁷ Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest. ²⁸ **So take the talent from him and give it to him who has the ten talents.**

• Note: For not utilizing the talent he began to look for people to blame. He ended up blaming his owner; he was afraid, and he hid it. The result: condemned by his own words and without the joy of the Lord. If we don't act and use our gifts we can come across fear and hide them, then we would look for someone to blame, oh very well we can end up blaming the Lord, and we would go around without trusting that we will be faithful in the least and without the joy of the Lord in our lives.

3. Parable of the unfaithful steward:

Luke 16:1-7 He also said to the disciples, "There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was wasting his possessions.² And he called him and said to him, 'What is this that I hear about you? Turn in the account of your management, for you can no longer be manager.'³ And the manager said to himself, 'What shall I do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg.⁴ I have decided what to do, so that when I am removed from management, people may receive me into their houses.'⁵ So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he said to the first, 'How much do you owe my master?'⁶ He said, 'A hundred measures of oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty.'⁷ Then he said to another, 'And how much do you owe?' He said, 'A hundred measures of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and write eighty.'

Characteristics of the unfaithful steward	Bible Verse	
Used Sagacity	Luke 16:8 So the master commended the unjust steward because he had dealt shrewdly. For the sons of this world are more shrewd in their generation than the sons of light.	
He won the hearts of the rest	Luke 16:9 "And I say to you, make friends for yourselves by unrighteous mammon, that when you fail, they may receive you into an everlasting home.	

• Note: The Lord reminds us that if we are faithful in the least, we would be faithful in the most. (Luke 16:10); if we are faithful with what is not ours, with the least over the most God will place us, (remember what ours is not is God's). The Lord Jesus Christ said that this world very shrewd by the good treatment of others, and it is yet another talent we can practice, give a just treatment to others.

4. Parable of the 10 minas:

Luke 19:16-27 "¹⁶ Then came the first, saying, 'Master, your mina has earned ten minas.' ¹⁷ And he said to him, 'Well done, good servant; because you were faithful in a very little, have authority over ten cities.' ¹⁸ And the second came, saying, 'Master, your mina has earned five minas.' ¹⁹ Likewise he said to him, 'You also be over five cities.'²⁰ "Then another came, saying, 'Master, here is your mina, which I have kept put away in a handkerchief. ²¹ For I feared you, because you are an austere man. You collect what you did not deposit and reap what you did not sow.' ²² And he said to him, 'Out of your own mouth I will judge you, you wicked servant. You knew that I was an austere man, collecting what I did not deposit and reaping what at my coming I might have collected it with interest?' ²⁴ "And he said to those who stood by, 'Take the mina from him, and give it to him who has ten minas.' ²⁵ (But they said to him, 'Master, he has ten minas.') ²⁶ 'For I say to you, that to everyone who has will be given; and from

him who does not have, even what he has will be taken away from him. ²⁷ But bring here those enemies of mine, who did not want me to reign over them, and slay them before me.'

Minas	Servant	Cities
Servant: 1 mina won 10	Faithful servant	10 cities
Servant: 1 mina won 5	Faithful servant	5 cities
Servant: 1 mina he hid it	Wicked servant	Thrown out

 Note: Here they deal with cities. God blesses us immensely, but we go back to the main principle, one has to be faithful in the least and He will put us over most. The wicked servant hid it and it was taken away from him. God entrusts us a bit more each day take advantage and continue in the joy of the Lord.

5. The payment of the owner to the laborers of the vine:

Matthew 20:1-16 "For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. 2 Now when he had agreed with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. 3 And he went out about the third hour and saw others standing idle in the marketplace, 4 and said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and whatever is right I will give you.' So they went. 5 Again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour, and did likewise. 6 And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing idle, and said to them, 'Why have you been standing here idle all day?' 7 They said to him, 'Because no one hired us.' He said to them, 'You also go into the vineyard, and whatever is right you will receive.'8 "So when evening had come, the owner of the vineyard said to his steward, 'Call the laborers and give them their wages, beginning with the last to the first.' 9 And when those came who were hired about the eleventh hour, they each received a denarius.10 But when the first came, they supposed that they would receive more; and they likewise received each a denarius. **11** And when they had received it, they complained against the landowner, **12** saying, 'These last men have worked only one hour, and you made them equal to us who have borne the burden and the heat of the day.' **13** But he answered one of them and said, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? **14** Take what is yours and go your way. I wish to give to this last man the same as to you. **15** Is it not lawful for me to do what I wish with my own things? Or is your eye evil because I am good?' **16** So the last will be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen."

Schedule	Salary

9:00 a.m. & 12:00 p.m.	One denarius	
3:00 p.m. & 5:00 p.m.	One denarius	

 Note: They got paid equally, the owner dealt with them one denarius, which was fair. It doesn't matter if we have started our stewardship late in time, God is fair to reward us, regardless of how big or small the talent is, we just have to do it right for God.

Hebrews 6:10 For God is not unjust so as to overlook your work and the love that you have shown for his name in serving the saints, as you still do.

• Note: The time in this life is short. We have to be great stewards of our short life and use our time wisely. "Do not live as if we were never going to die and die as if we had never lived."

2. Can we talk about time to search for God?

A= Yes.

Time to search for God	Bible Verse
Pray while he can be found	Psalm 32:6 Therefore let everyone who is godly offer prayer to you at a time when you may be found; surely in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach him.
Pray in the time of His good will (Propitious)	Psalm 69:13 But as for me, my prayer is to you, O Lord. At an acceptable time, O God, in the abundance of your steadfast love answer me in your saving faithfulness.
Search Him today	Psalm 95:7 For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand. Today, if you hear his voice ,
We are heard in favorable timing	Isaiah 49:8 Thus says the Lord: "In a time of favor I have answered you; in a day of salvation I have helped you; I will keep you and give you as a covenant to the people, to establish the land, to apportion the desolate heritages,
Always be in the adequate timing	2 Corinthians 6:2 For he says, " IN A FAVORABLE TIME I LISTENED TO YOU , AND IN A DAY OF SALVATION I HAVE HELPED YOU."

• Note: As good stewards of time, we shall look for God in the scriptures, in prayer, in church, give Him his time. God honors those who honor Him, and as a result there is no confusion in times of trouble, because we would know we are in the timing of God.

3. The good use of time:

Good use of Time	Bible Verse
Remember your Creator in your youth days	Ecclesiastes 12:1 Remember also your Creator in the days of your youth, before the evil days come and the years draw near of which you will say, "I have no pleasure in them"
Utilizing time wisely	Ephesians 5:15-16 See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, ¹⁶ redeeming the time, because the days are evil.
Walk wisely with the outsiders	Colossians 4:5 Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time.
There is a time for everything	Ecclesiastes 3:1 For everything there is a season , and a time for every matter under heaven

 Note: through being a good steward we are recognizing our Creator, also giving Him his time. A lot of spiritual leaders have beautiful talents, but if they don't know how to use them in the given moment, they are not being a good steward. I motivate you to use your talents in these precise moments of God.

4. Stewardship of the Treasures

INTRODUCTION

We have learned to use the talents and their benefits, in the same manner the times of God, and now we will learn to be good stewards of the treasures of God.

1. How should our relationship as a steward of Jesus Christ be?

A= It needs to be intimate, with a lot of privileges, but using the stewardship correctly.

Relationship with Christ	Bible Verse
We live for Jesus Christ	Romans 14:8-9 For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. ⁹ For to this end Christ died and lived again, that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.
We are His collaborators	1 Corinthians 3:9 For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, you are God's building.
We are inheritors	Galatians 4:4-7 ⁴ But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, ⁵ to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. ⁶ And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying out, "Abba, Father!" ⁷ Therefore you are no longer a slave but a son, and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

A= Yes. God since the beginning of creation has placed stewards.

5. Stewardship of Tithing and Offering

JESUS AND THE TITHES

There is some doctrines that teach that Jesus Christ never mentioned tithing, but the only way to expand the Kingdom of God is by tithing and offering, not doing this we will stop the Kingdom of god, I repeat God doesn't need our money, He does it to see our obedience, of course because He wants to bless us.

1. Does the Lord teach about the tithes?

A= Yes.

Luke 11:42 "But woe to you Pharisees! For you tithe mint and rue and every herb, and neglect justice and the love of God. These you ought to have done, without neglecting the others.

• Note: The Lord exhorted the Pharisees, he admonishes them, but he doesn't prohibit them to keep on tithing, he made an emphasis that it was necessary to do both things.

2. Where to I need to pay the tithes?

A= In the place where you spiritually feed in, in this case our local church.

Malachi 3:10 Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need.

• Note: Tithing is a blessing, imagine the windows of heaven open for you, besides that he would rebuke the devourer, without forgetting that God asks us to try Him in this.

3. Is there blessings when I tithe? A= Yes, there is 7 in Malachi 3:10-12

• Note: God desires you to have these 7 blessings in your life, besides showing that God is an Almighty God; but if you don't obey God, you will have the total opposite, because He is the one that opens doors and rebukes the devourer.

4. What happens if I don't tithe nor make an offering?

A= We would stop the Kingdom of God and we would carry curse among ourselves.

Malachi 3:8-9 ⁸ Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. But you say, 'How have we robbed you?' In your tithes and contributions. ⁹ You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing me, the whole nation of you.

 Note: It depends on us to advance or to stop the Kingdom of God, by not being obedient with what he asks of us for his benefit and for the expanding of the Kingdom.

5. Can I borrow the tithes?

A= Yes, but a 20% will be added.

Leviticus 27:31 If a man wishes to redeem some of his tithe, he shall add a fifth to it.

• Note: God is our best partner, if we take a portion we shall recover it and pay 20%more (5th part). God put his interest at a high rate so we would not get accustomed to be taking form his tithes. Many Christians borrow and don't replenish the fifth part, which can in time turn into a vice. I motivate you to not fall into that mistake and learn to be wise administrators.

STEWARDSHIP OF THE OFFERINGS

6. How can I administer the other 90%?

A=

- Give offerings to God (According to your gratefulness)
- Bless your family
- Help charities
- Help the poor
- Help constructions
 - Note: Many want to do this with the tithes, and this is not Gods plan. The tithes are to pay God. The offerings are from the rest, from the 90%. Many make an offering much more than the tithing in thankfulness with God, they don't know how to compensate for salvation, family unity, economic prosperity, at last everything within their life.

• Note: In this text the word all your produce, but it is because He is going to bless and there will always be overabundance.

3. God established this to bless me?

A= Yes, He always wants to bless us.

Exodus 22:29 "You shall not delay to offer from the fullness of your harvest and from the outflow of your presses. The firstborn of your sons you shall give to me.

- A good steward doesn't slow down the first fruits because they now that the Kingdom of God stops.
- A good steward does it with all their heart, they don't battle and give their best.

- God gave his only son (Jesus), he gave from his first fruits for humanity, He could have sent his best angel, but that wouldn't have been from the first fruits.
- Jesus gave himself completely to be a first fruit for our freedom and also giving us eternal life.

4. Where do I need to give my first fruits?

A= In the house of the Lord.

• There is many trying to give wherever they feel like, and that is not God's plan, in this manner they can come to think that it is for us and not for the work of God.

Exodus 34:26 The best of the first fruits of your ground you shall bring to the house of the Lord your God. You shall not boil a young goat in its mother's milk."

5. Are the tithes and the first fruits the same?

A= No.

- <u>Tithes:</u> Is to put apart one tenth of what God has blessed us
- First Fruits: Is to give of the first and the essential (the best) to the Lord

1 Chronicles 31:5,12 ⁵ As soon as the command was spread abroad, the people of Israel gave in abundance the first fruits of grain, wine, oil, honey, and of all the produce of the field. And they brought in abundantly the tithe of everything. ¹² And they faithfully brought in the contributions, the tithes, and the dedicated things. The chief officer in charge of them was Conaniah the Levite, with Shimei his brother as second,

• Note: First of all the people gave many first fruits on top of the abundant tithes; let's not struggle to give.

6. God has given us the first fruits of his Holy Spirit?

A= Yes, he saved it specially for us.

Romans 8:23 And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies.

• Note: The Holy Spirit contributes to our gift of being adopted as sons and daughters of God, he gives us a taste of what is to come in the eternity.

7. God has renamed us his first fruits?

A= God has given us the greatest gift of all "The Regeneration"

- It is to be born again, or a new birth
- We are the first fruits of the new birth that Christ gives us

James 1:18 Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of first fruits of his creatures.

8. What do we need to do to be stewards that give the first fruits to God?

- We need to know in our hearts that God gave from his first fruits to set an example for us, his stewards
- We need to think in our hearts that we ourselves are first fruits of the Lord
- We need to think like a steward, that everything is of the Lord and if we give from our first fruits, He will bless us
- We need to practice in our daily lives that whatever comes into our lives, comes with a purpose, and we need to deposit the first fruits.
 - **Conclusion:** I desire that the Lord receives you in heaven and tells you: "Go on, good and faithful servant": That is why we have to understand "All the first fruits are for my Lord and King Jesus".

8. Steward that gives to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God

INTRODUCTION

A good steward of God knows that they have to pay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar. It is the one that pays their taxes due and is up to date in all their payments and never owes anything to anyone, because they know that the one that prospers them is the owner of all things. They are also the ones that give to God what belongs to God (they never struggle to pay to God).

1. Did Jesus give this ordinance?

A= Yes, Jesus established this for the growth of each country in the world and the growth of the Kingdom of God here on earth.

Luke 20:22,25²² Is it lawful for us to give tribute to Caesar, or not?"

²⁵ He said to them, "Then render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

2. Would Jesus and the disciples pay taxes?

A= Yes, because He came to fulfill all law and justice.

Mateo **17:24-27** ²⁴ When they came to Capernaum, the collectors of the two-drachma tax went up to Peter and said, "Does your teacher not pay the tax?" ²⁵ He said, "Yes." And when he came into the house, Jesus spoke to him first, saying, "What do you think, Simon? From whom do kings of the earth take toll or tax? From their sons or from others?" ²⁶ And when he said, "From others," Jesus said to him, "Then the sons are free. ²⁷ However, not to give offense to them, go to the sea and cast a hook and take the first fish that comes up, and when you open its mouth you will find a shekel. Take that and give it to them for me and for yourself."

• Note: We see the Lord Jesus giving Peter a great lesson on paying taxes and showing him that He will always provide to his faithful stewards.

3. Should we respect our authorities?

A= Yes we should, because the Lord established them for our good.

Romans 13:1,4 ¹Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. ⁴for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer.

4. What happens if I don't obey?

A= It will lead to problems, since you oppose to what God established.

Romans 13:2-3 ²Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment. ³For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval

5. If I pay my taxes, will I live in a better country?

A= Absolutely yes, that concept is born within God's heart for all the nations.

Romans 13:6-7 ⁶For because of this you also pay taxes, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. ⁷Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed.

6. How do I give to God what belongs to God?

A= With joy.

2 Corinthians 9:7 Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

• **Note:** The faithful steward finds joy in this, to look beyond and know in their hearts that the Kingdom of God is expanding.

7. Does God want to bless us?

A= Yes but he wants us to submit to his way of thinking.

Genesis 14:18-21 ¹⁸ And Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine. (He was priest of God Most High.) ¹⁹ And he blessed him and said, "Blessed be Abram by God Most High, Possessor of heaven and earth. ²⁰ and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!" And Abram gave him a tenth of everything. ²¹ And the king of Sodom said to Abram, "Give me the persons, but take the goods for yourself."

9. Can I borrow from the tithes?

A= Yes, but an additional 20% (1/5) of interest shall be paid, because the money is form the Kingdom of God and not ours.

Leviticus 27:31 If a man wishes to redeem some of his tithe, he shall add a fifth to it.

• Note: God believes in the expansion of His Kingdom, that is why he placed and interest (20% more).

10. How can I fulfill this command? (to Caesar what is Caesar's, to God what is God's)

- Putting it to practice
- Start paying
- I need to trust in God and give Him what is his with joy
- There is more millionaires wanting to give than Christians crying out to God for blessings
- I have to act as Abraham; give to God the tithes and believe that it is God who blesses and not man
- I need to be of blessing, and not always asking or in debt
- I need to practice and teach these principles.

• **Conclusion:** I desire with all my heart that you take this teaching within you and you be a steward that understands the perfect will of God, with an ample vision to expand His Kingdom: "Giving to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's."

9. The Steward with their Family

INTRODUCTION

A good steward of God needs to be a good administrator of the quality time that they offer to their family.

1. Who make up my family?

A= First my spouse and kids.

Genesis 2:24 Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh.

- God established to leave our parents and start a new family; "my family".
 - Note: All marital problems are because you didn't abide by what God established in Genesis 2:24.

2. How should I treat my family?

A= With lots of love and respect.

1 Peter 3:7 Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered.

Ephesians 6:4 Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

Psalm 127:3-4 Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from him. ⁴Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth.

• Note: Our spouse if she is a daughter of God, we can see God as "our father in law". And we must love our children, that implies taking care of them even of themselves, but giving them the freedom of a family.

3. Do I need to provide for my family?

A= Yes, we must since God has entrusted them to us.

1 Timothy 5:8 But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever.

• At times there is parents helping other people even their closest ones and that is good, but if we unprotect your spouse and kids, you are doing the complete opposite of God's plan.

4. Two blessings we must imitate:

- 1- In God's people, the word of God was taught since a young age and forever.
- 2- The second blessing was to teach their children the profession that the parents would do.
 - Teaching the little kids at all times.

Deuteronomy 6:2 that you may fear the Lord your God, you and your son and your son's son, by keeping all his statutes and his commandments, which I command you, all the days of your life, and that your days may be long.

• Noah working with all his family making the ark, and teaching them his profession.

Genesis 7:1 Then the Lord said to Noah, "Go into the ark, you and all your household, for I have seen that you are righteous before me in this generation.

• Note: We need to teach our children, we are their superheroes and they want to be like us. We need to correspond to them, encouraging them and teaching them everything.

5. Was Jesus also taught?

A= Yes, his earthly father, Joseph, taught him the Scriptures and how to be a carpenter.

Jesus was taught as follows:	Bible Verse
as the son of the	Mateo 13:55 Is this not the carpenter's son? Is not His mother called Mary? And His brothers James, Joses, Simon, and Judas?
Jesus at the age of 12, would ask the teachers questions	Luke 2:43-46 When they had finished the days, as they returned, the Boy Jesus lingered behind in Jerusalem. And Joseph and His mother did not know it; ⁴⁴ but supposing Him to have been in the company, they went a day's journey, and sought Him among their relatives and acquaintances. ⁴⁵ So when they did not find Him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking Him. ⁴⁶ Now so it was that after three days they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions.

• **Note:** Jesus presented himself as Son of God at the age of 30 years, the scriptures and his profession were taught by his earthly parents.

6. Using quality time with our kids.

- We work 8 hours and we have 16 hours to utilize them correctly
- We need to have contact with our kids for at least 2 hours a day, helping them in their homework and spending time with them
- We need to have quality time and fun
- We need to have quality time teaching them about God (His word, prayer, giving gifts, etc.)

- We need to teach them sports, music, other languages, etc.
- We need to teach them about our profession.
 - **Note:** All of this promotes quality time with our children.
- 7. Quality time with my spouse.
 - We need to give ourselves mutual time

Ecclesiastes 9:9 Live joyfully with the wife whom you love all the days of your vain life which He has given you under the sun, all your days of vanity; for that is your portion in life, and in the labor which you perform under the sun.

- To have joy "everyday" means that we must have those moments of joy in all the areas
- Fellowship
- Plan together
- Enjoy together
- Live quality intimate moments.
 - Note: Happy marriages practice all this because it is the style of God and not the style of men.

8. Quality time with your whole family.

- We need to have those fun family moments
- Plan together as a family (everyone can have an opinion and can decide)
- We can go together to a sports event, the theater, etc.; enjoy it and repeat often
- Have a relationship with God as a family
- Have moral teachings as a family.

- Note: All this promotes family unity in all the areas of our lives and we will be happy families because we will be doing this the way of The Creator.
- **Conclusion:** I desire with all my heart that you take this teaching and practice it, so you may be a steward that administrates time wisely with their family.

INTRODUCTION

A faithful steward knows that they have time for anything; and he must have time to seek God and work in a ministry (work); the faithful steward although they have a secular job and a family, they know how to give time to help in the Kingdom of God, serving him.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 To everything there is a season, A time for every purpose under heaven:

1. How should the butler be with his ministry?

2. Has God given us work for Him?

A= Yes, He will always use his creation to do his redeeming work.

Ecclesiastes 3:10-12 ¹⁰ I have seen the business that God has given to the children of man to be busy with. ¹¹ He has made everything beautiful in its time. Also, he has put eternity into man's heart, yet so that he cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end. ¹² I perceived that there is nothing better for them than to be joyful and to do good as long as they live;

• **Note:** God has given us a wonderful task here on earth, to preach the gospel to every creature, prepare them so they can do their wonderful task.

9. Advice from Jesus.

Luke 16:9-12 And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth, so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal dwellings. ¹⁰ "One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. ¹¹ If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹² And if you have not been faithful in that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own?

- Be faithful in the least, and in the most we will also be faithful
- The exhortation: Who will entrust to us what is true?
- If we are unfaithful with what is not ours, who will give us what is ours?
- If we are unfaithful with riches here on earth, how will the eternal riches be entrusted to us?
- We must learn to be faithful with all that we have here on earth, in order to be faithful with the eternal things.
 - Note: God trials our capacity to receive the true riches of heaven (what is ours) with how we us our earthly possessions.
- If our hearts are not ready to be a good faithful steward here on earth with the material things and our riches, if we struggle to give; how can the riches of the Kingdom of God be entrust in us?
- We need to practice good stewardship, starting with our belongings, so the Lord can entrust in us the greater and powerful things of His Kingdom.

• **Conclusion:** I desire with all my heart that we be great stewards, so that God can find favor in our work and tell us: "Good and faithful servant, you have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much".
